All entries must be made online this year.

Entry Information

- Limit of 20 entries per exhibitor. This includes group classes and showmanship.
- **All entries must be made online at clevelandcountyfair.com.** Follow the links on the fair’s website to Cleveland County Fair’s Blue Ribbon Online Entry page. Entries and payments must be received by Cleveland County Fair by 4 p.m. Wednesday, September 14, 2022.
- There is a one-time \$2.00 fee to create an online account.
- Payment must be made online through the Blue Ribbon software. Follow instructions to enter your payment information upon checkout. Registration and payments must be received by 4:00 p.m. September 14, 2022. Note that registration is not considered complete until Cleveland County Fair has received payment for any fees.
- An exhibitor is defined as the owner or owner(s) whose name(s) appears as the owner on the registration or recordation certificate or stamped duplicate application. Multiple names under one ID number are one exhibitor (ADGA Show Rules N23).
- Proof of ownership shall be the ADGA ID# on the registration or recordation certificate or on the stamped duplicate application. All names included on one ID number constitute only one membership, therefore, only one exhibitor. (A6)
- Original Registration/recordation certificates must be presented at check-in. For 2022, exhibitors should read carefully ADGA’s announcement referencing stamped duplicate registration applications.
- If entering under more than one ADGA ID#, you must create separate Blue Ribbon accounts for each ADGA ID#. Each ADGA ID # represents one exhibitor.
- When making entries online, enter Exhibitor’s/Owner’s ADGA ID# in the field labeled RFID/National ID. Also enter owner’s name in Owner 1 Field and ADGA ID# in Owner 2 field.
- Dairy goats entered in competition under incorrect exhibitor/owner ADGA ID numbers will be disqualified.
- Persons showing animals whose registration/recordation certificates have signed transfers that have not been processed by the ADGA office must show those animals in the owner’s name shown on ADGA records at that time. (A7)
- A youth showing animals registered to a Farm/Family must be listed on the Farm Card that is issued from ADGA, and the Farm Card must be presented at time of show. The Farm Card **must** also be uploaded during the online entry process or emailed to onlineentriesccf@hotmail.com.
- Only one youth per Farm/Family will be allowed to be the exhibitor in the Youth Show under one ADGA ID number. The Youth Show (BSJ) is considered one show for this rule and encompasses all breed divisions.

Having one exhibitor per ADGA ID number aids the show secretary in accurately counting the number of exhibitors and enforcing the ADGA rule that one ADGA ID number constitutes one exhibitor.

- The youth exhibitor will provide his/her Social Security Number instead of the Farm’s EIN as any premium checks and IRS forms will be issued in the name of this exhibitor.
- Cleveland County Fair may request that exhibitors email or upload copies of the owner’s certificates to the online portal to verify ownership/eligibility prior to the show. Anyone not complying with this request may be disqualified. This is to avoid any last minute disqualifications upon check-in due to exhibitor/ownership issues.
- Youth organizations such as FFA, 4H groups, etc., may enter under the organization’s name provided the organization owns the animals and the animals are registered under the organization’s ADGA ID number.
- All exhibitors and entries must comply with Cleveland County Fair rules. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read and be familiar with ALL rules.

Check-In

- Present Certificate of Veterinary Inspection to health inspector prior to offloading. A health check of all animals will be performed on the grounds. Those animals showing signs of illness will be barred from entry.
- Vehicles and trailers must be moved to Livestock Parking area outside of Gate 10 immediately after unloading.
- No animals will be allowed to be offloaded prior to 3:00 pm Friday, October 1. All animals must be pre-registered for competition. Only animals registered in competitions will be allowed to be offloaded.
- After animals are penned, bring original registration certificates to the entry table to verify that information contained in the Show Book is correct. Bring Farm/Family card if applicable.
- See the Director for gate admission and parking pass.

Rules & Regulations

- Competition is open to animals registered or recorded in the American Dairy Goat Association, American Goat Society, or the Canadian Goat Society.
- This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association as a Combined Senior Doe/Junior Doe Youth Show only. ADGA rules shall govern sanctioned shows. Visit adga.org for complete details.
- All entries must comply with both ADGA and Cleveland County Fair rules. It is the exhibitor’s responsibility to read and be familiar with all rules.
- The base date for computing age of animals is October 1, 2022.
- There is no pre-show milk-out.
- All animals entering the grounds must be accompanied by a valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health papers) dated within 60 days of show and must comply with USDA Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines. See Livestock and Horse Health Regulations at clevelandcountyfair.com.
- Pens are made available to exhibitors on a first-come, first-served basis. Exhibitors are asked to use pens sparingly to provide space for others.
- The Open Dairy Goat Show (BS) and the Youth Dairy Goat Show (BSJ) are collectively limited to 200 head. Once the maximum number of animals has been reached, no other registrations will be accepted. This

encompasses the Senior Doe Divisions, Junior Doe Divisions, and Breed Divisions of the Open and Youth Shows.

- Online entries received after the limit of 200 head has been reached will be struck from the book, and exhibitors will be refunded for any entry fees for said entries. Deletions will be based upon the date/time stamp for submissions/payments within the Blue Ribbon Online portal.
- Cleveland County Fair will provide base bedding for animal pens. Exhibitors may bring wood shavings for topdressing. Bedding with straw is NOT permitted.
- Exhibitors removing their animals prior to the announced release time shall forfeit all premiums earned.
- Handlers must be capable of showing animals without assistance in the show ring.
- No exhibitor shall receive more than 2 premiums per class.
- Substitutions of animals will be allowed only within a Breed Division (same breed, same division). This rule will be strictly enforced. The exhibitor must notify the Cleveland County Fair Office (704-487-0651) of any substitutions three days prior to check-in date.
- No animal will be allowed to be offloaded onto Cleveland County Fairgrounds if the animal has not been pre-registered for competition prior to arriving at the Fair. Please do not bring any animals that are not pre-registered, i.e., extra goats. This could result in disqualification from competition.
- Cleveland County Fair No Milk, No Money Rule: Any Senior Doe that is ADGA qualified to show in a sanctioned show may show in its appropriate class in the Open and/or Youth shows. However, any doe that is not in milk in the Open Senior Doe show or the Youth Senior Doe Division will not receive any premiums. You must still pay a nonrefundable entry fee to compete in the Open Senior Doe show. Whether premiums are given is not an ADGA matter and does not affect the show sanction.
