Entry Fees & Deadlines:

- No entry fee
- Early Entry: September 6, 2023
- Late Entry: September 14, 2023 No entries will be accepted after this date.
- Make your entries early. The show is limited to available tie space, which is 125 head. Tie spaces are assigned in the order entries are received.

Check-In:

Thursday, September 28 from 12 N - 5 PM

- Do not offload until you have spoken with the NCDA&CS veterinarian regarding health inspections.
- Animals showing signs of disease will be returned promptly to the farm of origin.
- Show directors reserve the right of declining any entry.
- Certificates of Veterinary Inspection are only required for out-of-state animals (see Livestock Health Regulations).
- Vehicles and trailers must be moved to Livestock Parking outside Gate 10 immediately after unloading. See director for parking pass at check-in.
- After your animals are tied, bring your registration paper to the entry table to verify that the information contained in the Show Order is correct.

Show Time:

Friday, September 29 at 4 PM

Release Time:

Friday, September 29 at 8 PM

Exhibitors removing their animals prior to the announced release time shall forfeit all premiums earned.

Guidelines:

- Animals entered in the Junior Dairy Show are eligible to compete in the Open Show, provided they are entered separately under the same youth exhibitor's name.
- Junior exhibits will show at the same time and with animals shown in the Open Show. When the judge completes each class, ribbons will be presented and placings recorded for the Open Show. Junior exhibitors will then step forward to determine their placings in the Junior Show.
- Juniors may not enter group classes. However, Junior exhibits may be used to complete group classes in the Open Show provided they are owned by the same family or farm.
- Youth must enter the appropriate age class in order to compete in fitting & showmanship.
- No animal is allowed to compete in group classes unless it is also entered in an individual class.

Rules & Regulations:

- Animals must be registered, and copies of registration papers must be available for inspection by show officials.
- All animals must be in possession of the owner and have been in the care of the exhibitor for at least 30 days prior to the Fair.
- To compete, exhibitors must be capable of showing their animals without assistance in the show ring. Exhibitors must be at least 5 years old.
- Exhibitors must maintain control of their animals at all times.
- Feed and bedding must be provided by the exhibitor. Cleveland County Fair will provide a base bedding of sawdust, and exhibitors will supply topdressing. Straw is not permitted.
- Exhibitors are expected to:
 - Accept assigned tie spaces without controversy

- Provide on-site supervision of the animals
- Keep the space they occupy clean, organized, and attractive
- Remove litter or equipment promptly as instructed by the director(s)
- Keep their animals clean
- Display current Cleveland County Fair ribbons
- Display their animals as directed
- Cooperate with directors to increase the educational value of the show
- An experience judge will pass on each class and shall determine proper placing in the absence of any competition. Should unsound, inferior, or distinctly unworthy specimens be presented, the Fair is under no obligation to decorate them with ribbons or distribute premiums as scheduled.
- There will be no classes offered or premiums awarded for any breed show with fewer than three (3) entries.
- Discourteous and unsportsmanlike behavior will by exhibitors or ringside affiliates will not be tolerated. Violation could lead to disqualification and a one-year ban from showing dairy cattle at the Cleveland County Fair.
- **Cleveland County Fair shall not be responsible for any accident which may occur to or by reason of any exhibit animals. The exhibitor shall hold Cleveland County Fair blameless and indemnify them against any legal proceedings arising from such actions.**
